

FAMILY GUIDE

Airport Scavenger Hunt

AIRPORT SCAVENGER HUNT RULES

✓ **Stick Together**

Talk about interesting facts or ask questions about the airport or your travel destination.

✓ **Have fun and Celebrate!**
